2.	<p>Zoning for Licensed Marijuana Grows (Optional Premises Cultivation) & Medical Marijuana-Infused Products Manufacturers (MIPs) – Peter Wysocki, Director, Planning and Development</p> <p>The task force will finalize its recommendation to City Council regarding possible zoning limitations for these business types – three options coming from staff based on task force conversations: (1) leave them as is (no restrictions other than not in residential zones); (2) limit them to industrial (M1 & M2) zones; or (3) limit to industrial (M1 & M2) zones, but allow conditional use applications into commercial (C5 & C6) zones.</p>	1:05PM
